



## 4th Grade Webelos Scouts



**Have you added new members to your Webelos den?** If any new boys join your den this year, make certain they complete the requirements to earn their Bobcat badge. Tell the parents they must complete at home Bobcat Requirement 8, using “How to Protect Your Children from Child Abuse: A Parent’s Guide,” in the front of the *Webelos Handbook*.

### Helpful Hints for Den Leaders

The tone you set at the first meeting will determine, to a large extent, the success of your year. Wear your adult uniform to all meetings and remind boys to wear their uniforms. Be completely organized before the start of the meeting. Explain clearly to the boys the behavioral expectations. You may wish to use the “good conduct candle” approach (*Cub Scout Leader How-To Book*). Be friendly but firm with the boys.

Ask your assistant den leader (or parent helper) to arrive at least 15 minutes before the starting time of the meeting. He or she can help you with final preparations before the boys arrive.

During the summer between the third and fourth grade, the boys should be encouraged to earn Cub Scout Academics and Sports belt loops and pins. Many of their summer activities will fulfill requirements for these. By participating in pack summer activities, boys may earn the National Summertime Pack Award pin.

These meeting plans include many suggested field trips. Depending on your circumstances, you may not be able to plan or have access to all of these field-trip opportunities. Webelos activity badges can be earned in your regular den meeting location as long as the requirements are met. Inviting an expert in a chosen field to assist at your den meeting could be a great way to complete requirements.

At least two weeks before any field trip, a local tour permit should be filed with the council service center. A permission slip (informed consent agreement) should also be secured from the parent or guardian of each Webelos Scout.

In order for all of the boys to complete Webelos badge requirement 6 (plan and lead a flag ceremony in your den that includes the U.S. flag), each boy should be assigned a meeting for which he can plan and lead a flag ceremony. At the end of each meeting, remind the boy who will be planning the next meeting’s ceremony so he can prepare. A flag ceremony can be as simple as reciting the Pledge of Allegiance and reciting the Cub Scout Promise. Wolf Achievement 2b in the *Wolf Handbook* offers examples of simple flag ceremonies.

A snack at den meetings is optional. Set the example with healthy, nutritious snacks. Be aware of any food allergies of den members and communicate these to parents who may be assisting with the snacks.

Distribute the Family Talent Survey Sheet prior to or at the first den meeting. (The Family Talent Survey Sheet can be found at [www.scouting.org/CubScouts/CubScoutingForms/forms](http://www.scouting.org/CubScouts/CubScoutingForms/forms) and on the CD in the Resources folder on the main menu). Ask for it to be returned to you within a week. It will be a helpful tool for you to identify parent resources within your den.

You may wish to distribute a family information letter at the conclusion of each den meeting. (A sample family information letter can be found at [www.scouting.org/CubScouts/Resources](http://www.scouting.org/CubScouts/Resources) and on the CD in the Resources folder on the main menu). The letter tells parents what was completed at each meeting and provides information on upcoming den and pack meetings and activities.

Encourage the boys to earn the religious emblem of their faith. Talk about earning the National Summertime Pack Award pin, the Cub Scout Outdoor Activity Award, the Cub Scout World Conservation Award (if not already earned as a Cub Scout), and Cub Scouting's Leave No Trace Awareness Award during the year. Distribute and review the Leave No Trace frontcountry guidelines before any field trip to a park or playground. (The guidelines can be found at [www.scouting.org/CubScouts/Resources/leavenotrace](http://www.scouting.org/CubScouts/Resources/leavenotrace) and on the CD in the Resources folder on the main menu.)

Open each den meeting by saluting the U.S. flag and reciting the Pledge of Allegiance. While showing the Cub Scout sign, recite the Cub Scout Promise and Law of the Pack. Optionally, you may choose to also show the Boy Scout sign and recite the Scout Oath and Scout Law. See *Cub Scout Ceremonies for Dens and Packs* for detailed guidelines and ceremony examples.

### **Cub Scout Promise**

The pack helps the Cub Scout grow.  
The Cub Scout gives goodwill.

### **Scout Oath**

On my honor I will do my best  
To do my duty to God and my country  
and to obey the Scout Law;  
To help other people at all times;  
To keep myself physically strong,  
mentally awake, and morally straight.

### **Scout Law**

A Scout is trustworthy, loyal, helpful, friendly, courteous, kind, obedient, cheerful, thrifty, brave, clean, and reverent.

### **Outdoor Code**

*As an American, I will do my best to—*

*Be clean in my outdoor manners.* I will treat the outdoors as a heritage. I will take care of it for myself and others. I will keep my trash and garbage out of lakes, streams, fields, woods, and roadways.

*Be careful with fire.* I will prevent wildfire. I will build my fires only when and where they are permitted and appropriate. When I have finished using fire, I will make sure it is cold-out. I will leave a clean fire ring, or remove all evidence of my fire.

*Be considerate in the outdoors.* I will treat public and private property with respect. I will follow the principles of Leave No Trace for all outdoors activities.

*Be conservation-minded.* I will learn about and practice good conservation of soil, waters, forests, minerals, grasslands, wildlife, and energy. I will urge others to do the same.

## Fourth-Grade Webelos Den Meeting #1

*Traveler activity badge (partial), Naturalist activity badge (partial)*

### Preparation and materials needed:

- Have a road map of your area with a map legend; have a map or timetable from a railroad, bus line, airline, subway, or light rail service. The line should serve the place where you live or near where you live.
- Read the Naturalist chapter in the *Webelos Handbook*.
- Research Naturalist requirement 7. Learn to identify poisonous plants and venomous reptiles found in your area (suggested resources: the Internet and the library).
- Prepare permission slips for the field trip at den meeting #2.

### Gathering:

- Collect den dues.
- Record attendance.

### Opening ceremony:

- Lead a flag ceremony. Recite the Pledge of Allegiance, the Cub Scout Promise, the Law of the Pack, the Scout Oath, and/or the Scout Law.

### Advancement:

Traveler activity badge requirements:

1. Get a map or timetable from a railroad, bus line, airline, subway, or light rail. The line should serve the place where you live or near where you live. Look up some places it goes.
2. Use a timetable to plan a trip from your home to a city in another state by railroad, bus, airline, or ferry.
10. On a road map of your area, find a place of interest and draw two different routes between it and your home. Use the map legend to determine which route is shorter in miles. (The “place of interest” may be your field-trip destination for den meeting #2.)

Naturalist activity badge requirements:

6. Learn about the bird flyways closest to your home. Find out which birds use these flyways.
7. Learn to identify poisonous plants and venomous reptiles found in your area.
9. Give examples of
  - A producer, a consumer, and a decomposer in the food chain of an ecosystem
  - One way humans have changed the balance of nature
  - How you can help protect the balance of nature
10. Identify a plant, bird, or wild animal that is found only in your area of the country. Tell why it survives only in your area.

In the boys' *Webelos Handbooks*, sign the requirements met.

### Closing:

- Remind the Webelos Scout who will plan and lead the next meeting's flag ceremony.
- Retire the colors.
- Hand out family information letter. (A sample family information letter can be found at [www.scouting.org/CubScouts/Resources](http://www.scouting.org/CubScouts/Resources) and on the CD in the Resources folder on the main menu. Also see the boxed text for suggested wording.)
- Hand out permission slips for the field trip at den meeting #2.

### Family Information Letter

- Please complete the following Webelos badge requirement before our next den meeting: Have an adult member of the family read the Webelos Scout Parent Guide and sign here (the "approved by" line following this requirement on page 49 of the *Webelos Handbook*).
- At the next meeting, the Webelos den will visit a museum of natural history, nature center, or zoo. Volunteer drivers are always welcome. Parent or guardian participation is required for completion of Traveler requirement 4.
- Traveler requirement 3: Help your Webelos Scout use the Internet to map directions to the location of the next den meeting. Bring these printed directions to the next den meeting.
- Please return the permission slip for the field trip.

### Next Up:

- For den meeting #2, plan for the den and den parents or guardians to visit a museum of natural history, nature center, or zoo.
- Submit a Local Tour Permit Application to your council service center two weeks before the field trip. (The Local Tour Permit Application can be found at [www.scouting.org/CubScouts/CubScoutingForms/forms](http://www.scouting.org/CubScouts/CubScoutingForms/forms) and on the CD in the Resources folder on the main menu.)

### Fourth-Grade Webelos Den Meeting #2

*Naturalist activity badge (completion), Traveler activity badge (completion)*

#### Preparation and materials needed:

- Make arrangements for the den and den parents or guardians to visit a museum of natural history, nature center, or zoo. Submit a Local Tour Permit Application to your council service center two weeks before the field trip. (The Local Tour Permit Application can be found at [www.scouting.org/CubScouts/CubScoutingForms/forms](http://www.scouting.org/CubScouts/CubScoutingForms/forms) and on the CD in the Resources folder on the main menu.)
- Prepare permission slips for the geology field trip at den meeting #3.

#### Gathering:

- Collect permission slips for this field trip as boys arrive.
- Collect den dues; record attendance.

#### Opening ceremony:

- A Webelos Scout should plan and lead the flag ceremony (Webelos badge requirement 6).
- Recite the Pledge of Allegiance, the Cub Scout Promise, Law of the Pack, Scout Oath, and/or Scout Law.

#### Advancement:

Naturalist activity badge requirements:

1. With your parent, guardian, or Webelos den leader, complete the Respect Character Connection.
  - a. **Know:** Tell what interested you most when completing the requirements for this activity badge. Tell what you learned about how you can show appreciation and respect for wildlife.
  - b. **Commit:** Tell things that some people have done that show a lack of respect for wildlife. Name ways that you will show respect for and protect wildlife.
  - c. **Practice:** Explain how completing the requirements for this activity badge gives you the opportunity to show respect.

4. Visit a museum of natural history, a nature center, or a zoo with your family, Webelos den, or pack. Tell what you saw.

Traveler activity badge requirements:

3. With the help of your parent, guardian, teacher, or librarian, use a map site on the Internet to plan a trip from your home to a nearby place of interest. Download and/or print the directions and a street map showing how to go from your home to the place you chose.
4. With your parent or guardian, take a trip to a place that interests you. Go by car, bus, boat, train, or plane.

In the boys' *Webelos Handbooks*, sign the requirements met.

#### Closing:

- Thank the field trip host for your visit.
- Remind the Webelos Scout who will plan and lead the next meeting's flag ceremony.
- Hand out family information letter. (A sample family information letter can be found at [www.scouting.org/CubScouts/Resources](http://www.scouting.org/CubScouts/Resources) and on the CD in the Resources folder on the main menu. Also see the boxed text for suggested wording.)
- Hand out permission slips for the geology field trip at den meeting #3.

- Retire the colors.
- Thank the field trip host for your visit.
- Remind the Webelos Scout who will plan and lead the next meeting's flag ceremony.
- Hand out family information letter. (A sample family information letter can be found at [www.scouting.org/CubScouts/Resources](http://www.scouting.org/CubScouts/Resources) and on the CD in the Resources folder on the main menu. Also see the boxed text for suggested wording.)

6. Explain one way in which mountains are formed.
7. Describe what a fossil is. How is it used to tell how old a formation is? Find two examples of fossils in your area.

In the boys' *Webelos Handbooks*, sign the requirements met.

### Closing:

- Clean up.
- Remind one boy that he is in charge of the flag ceremony at the next den meeting.
- Retire the colors.

## Fourth-Grade Webelos Den Meeting #5

*Forester activity badge (partial), Fitness activity badge (partial), Citizen activity badge (partial)*

### Preparation and materials needed:

- Bring a U.S. flag and the den flag.
- Bring poster board, colored pencils or markers, and a slice of a tree trunk showing growth rings.
- Read the Forester chapter in the *Webelos Handbook*.

### Gathering:

- Collect den dues.
- Record attendance.

### Opening ceremony:

- A Webelos Scout should plan and lead the flag ceremony (Webelos badge requirement 6).
- Recite the Pledge of Allegiance, the Cub Scout Promise, Law of the Pack, Scout Oath, and/or Scout Law.

### Advancement:

Forester activity badge requirements:

5. Draw a picture showing
  - How water and minerals in the soil help a tree grow
  - How the tree uses sunlight to help it grow
6. Make a poster showing a tree's growth rings or examine the growth rings of a tree stump. Explain how the rings tell its life history. (Show your slice of a tree trunk showing growth rings.)

Fitness activity badge requirement:

1. With your parent, guardian, or Webelos den leader, complete the Health and Fitness Character Connection.
  - a. **Know:** Tell why it is important to be healthy, clean, and fit.
  - b. **Commit:** Tell when it is difficult for you to stick with good health habits. Tell where you can go to be with others who encourage you to be healthy, clean, and fit.

- c. **Practice:** Practice good health habits while doing the requirements for this activity badge.

Citizen activity badge requirement:

8. As a Webelos Scout, earn the Cub Scout Academics belt loop for Citizenship.
- Citizenship belt loop requirement 3: Participate in a family, den, or school service project. (Discuss with the Webelos Scouts the service project you will be conducting. Ask them to bring canned and nonperishable food items to the next den meeting.)

In the boys' *Webelos Handbooks*, sign the requirements met.

### Closing:

- Ask boys to complete Fitness activity badge requirements 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, and 7 at home with their parents/guardians, who should sign the boy's handbook upon completion. Bring safety notebook (requirement 2) and record of meals (requirement 4) to the next den meeting. The Webelos Scout should be prepared to tell about what kinds of meals are best and why (requirement 3).
- Remind the Webelos Scout who will plan and lead the next meeting's flag ceremony.
- Retire the colors.
- Hand out family information letter. (A sample family information letter can be found at [www.scouting.org/CubScouts/Resources](http://www.scouting.org/CubScouts/Resources) and on the CD in the Resources folder on the main menu. Also see the boxed text for suggested wording.)

### Family Information Letter

The Webelos den is working on the Fitness activity badge. Please have the Webelos Scouts complete all these requirements at home and return items 2, 3, and 4 to the next den meeting.

2. With a parent or other adult family member, complete a safety notebook, which is discussed in the booklet "How to Protect Your Children from Child Abuse" that is in your *Webelos Handbook*.
3. Read the meal planning information in the Fitness activity badge chapter. With a parent or other family member, plan a week of meals. Explain what kinds of meals are best for you and why.
4. Keep a record of your daily meals and snacks for a week. Decide whether you have been eating foods that are good for you.
5. Tell an adult member of your family about the bad effects smoking or chewing tobacco would have on your body.
6. Tell an adult member of your family four reasons why you should not use alcohol and how it could affect you.
7. Tell an adult member of your family what drugs could do to your body and how they would affect your ability to think clearly.

The Webelos den is also working on the Citizen activity badge. Please help your Webelos Scout

complete the following Citizen activity badge requirement before our next meeting:

8. Citizenship belt loop requirement 3: Participate in a family, den, or school service project. For our Webelos den service project, we are collecting nonperishable food items to donate to a local food bank. Please have your Webelos Scout bring canned or nonperishable packaged food items to our next meeting.

**Next Up:**

- For den meeting #6, bring a U.S. flag and the den flag.
- Bring poster board, markers, glue, scissors, and *Boys' Life* magazines.
- Read the Webelos badge requirements in the *Webelos Handbook*.
- Prepare permission slips for the field trip at den meeting #7.

## Fourth-Grade Webelos Den Meeting #6

### Preparation and materials needed:

### Advancement:

Fitness activity badge requirement:

3. Have each boy share what he thinks are the best kinds of meals and why.

Webelos badge requirements:

3. Know and explain the meaning of the Webelos badge.
4. Point out the three special parts of the Webelos Scout uniform. Tell when to wear the uniform and when not to wear it.
7. Show that you know and understand the requirements to be a Boy Scout.
  - a. Demonstrate the Scout salute, Scout sign, and Scout handshake. Explain when you would use them.

- b. Explain the Scout Oath, Scout Law, Scout motto, and Scout slogan.
- c. Explain and agree to follow the Outdoor Code.

Citizen activity badge requirement:

8. As a Webelos Scout, earn the Cub Scout Academics belt loop for Citizenship.
  - Citizenship belt loop requirement 1: Develop a list of jobs you can do around the home. Chart your progress for one week. (Discuss this requirement with your Webelos Scouts. They are to complete this requirement at home before the next meeting.)
  - Citizenship belt loop requirement 2: Make a poster showing things that you can do to be a good citizen.

In the boys' *Webelos Handbooks*, sign the requirements met.

### Closing:

- Ask boys to complete Webelos badge and Citizenship belt loop requirements at home as assigned in the family information letter.
- Remind the Webelos Scout who will plan and lead the next meeting's flag ceremony.
- Retire the colors.
- Hand out family information letter. (A sample family information letter can be found at [www.scouting.org/CubScouts/Resources](http://www.scouting.org/CubScouts/Resources) and on the CD in the Resources folder on the main menu. Also see the boxed text for suggested wording.)
- Hand out permission slips for the field trip at den meeting #7.

(See the *Webelos Handbook*; the guidelines can also be found at [www.scouting.org/CubScouts/Resources/leavenotrace](http://www.scouting.org/CubScouts/Resources/leavenotrace) and on the CD in the Resources folder on the main menu.)
7. Discuss with your Webelos den leader the rules of outdoor fire safety. Using these rules, show how to build a safe fire and put it out.
8. With your accompanying adult on a campout or outdoor activity, assist in preparing, cooking, and cleanup for one of your den's meals. Tell why it is important for each den member to share in meal preparation and cleanup, and explain the importance of eating together.
10. Demonstrate how to whip and fuse the ends of a rope.
11. Demonstrate setting up a tent or dining fly using two half hitches and a taut-line hitch. Show how to tie a square knot and explain how it is used.

Forester activity badge requirements:

3. Identify six forest trees common to the area where you live. Tell how both wildlife and humans use them. (If you don't live in a region that has forests, read about one type of forest and name six of its trees and their uses.)
4. Identify six forest plants (other than trees) that are useful to wildlife. Tell which animals use them and for what purposes.
9. Describe both the benefits and the harm wildfires can caused in a forest ecosystem. Tell how you can help prevent wildfire.

In the boys' *Webelos Handbooks*, sign the requirements met.

**Closing:**

- Clean up.
- Remind boys to continue working on their Athlete progress chart and to return the chart at den meeting #16.
- Have boys recite the Outdoor Code.
- Retire the colors.

- Hand out family information letter. (A sample family information letter can be found at [www.scouting.org/CubScouts/Resources](http://www.scouting.org/CubScouts/Resources) and on the CD in the Resources folder on the main menu. Also see the boxed text for suggested wording.)
- Hand out permission slips for the outing to an ice cream shop at den meeting #16.

## 4th Grade Webelos Scouts



### Fourth-Grade Webelos Den Meeting #16

Enjoy a trip to an ice cream shop to reward yearlong good behavior.

- Collect permission slips as boys arrive.
- Collect Athlete progress charts from boys.

**Webelos Scouts who have participated in den meeting #13 and turned in the Athlete progress chart should now have earned the Athlete activity badge. It should be presented to qualifying Webelos Scouts at the next pack meeting.**

**The Webelos Scouts may now have earned the first compass point by earning four additional activity badges—Scholar, Outdoorsman, Forester, and Athlete. The compass point should be presented to qualifying Webelos Scouts at the next pack meeting.**

#### Next Up:

During the summer between the fourth and fifth grade:

- Distribute the Family Member activity badge chart (below) at least two months before den meeting #1. Set a due date for completion.
- Participate in pack summertime activities to earn the National Summertime Pack Award.
- It is recommended that the den plan an activity or outing at least once a month during the summer so that the den will qualify for the National Den Award. (The National Den Award requirements and application can be found at [www.scouting.org/CubScouts/CubScoutingForms/forms](http://www.scouting.org/CubScouts/CubScoutingForms/forms) and on the CD in the Resources folder on the main menu.)
- You may choose to use the Scout Oath and Scout Law as part of your opening, to allow the boys to learn them for the Arrow of Light Award requirements. Create a poster or purchase BSA item #34880B.
- If any new boys have joined your den, make certain they complete the Bobcat badge requirements before beginning other advancement.
- Distribute the Family Talent Survey Sheet to the parents of new boys, asking them to complete and return it to you at the next meeting. (The Family Talent Survey Sheet can be found at [www.scouting.org/CubScouts/CubScoutingForms/forms](http://www.scouting.org/CubScouts/CubScoutingForms/forms) and on the CD in the Resources folder on the main menu).

- Plan the next den meeting at the end of the summer, just before the beginning of the school year. Families of any nonswimmers should take swimming lessons over the summer to prepare for the Aquanaut activity badge at the end of the summer.
- At least one month in advance, make arrangements with an outdoor or indoor pool. Ask a lifeguard or water safety instructor to work with the boys. Give the Aquanaut activity badge and Swimming belt loop requirements to the lifeguard at least a week in advance.
- Arrange to have personal flotation devices available, as well as equipment for reaching and throwing rescues.
- Submit a Local Tour Permit Application to your council service center two weeks before this activity. (The Local Tour Permit Application can be found at [www.scouting.org/CubScouts/CubScoutingForms/forms](http://www.scouting.org/CubScouts/CubScoutingForms/forms) and on the CD in the Resources folder on the main menu)
- A minimum of one adult leader must complete Safe Swim Defense online training at the BSA Online Learning Center. Sign into the Online Learning Center through the MyScouting portal ([www.scouting.org/applications/myscouting](http://www.scouting.org/applications/myscouting)).
